HISTORICAL ACCOUNT

- Ādam Jui built Masjid-al-'Aqṣā (after building the Kaʿbah).
- **10,000 BCE** Jericho was built by Arab ancestors; the Nautifians.
- 5th millennium, i.e., 5000 BCE- permanent villages and working industries developed.
- 4th and 3rd millennium- the Semites were the most ancient nation known to live on Palestinian land.
- They migrated from the Arabian Peninsula to **Palestine**, which they named **Canaan**. They lived therein for thousands of years.



East of **Canaan** there was a land called **Sumer**, its capital **Ur (in IRAQ)**. Amorites captured and ruled this land for **hundreds of years**, when finally, **Hammurabi of Babylon** captured and took the land.



Ibrāhīm was born in Ur.

His teachings conflicted with his people, so with his life in danger, he took his wife and **nephew Lūț** and migrated to **Canaan** (**Palestine**).

- Ibrāhīm settled in Jerusalem.
- Ismā'īl عَلَيْ settled in Arabia.
- Ishāq juic settled in Palestine.
- Ibrāhīm المحكة rebuilt the Kaʿbah with Ismāʾīl المحكة and Masjid Al-ʾAqṣā with Ishāq المحكة.
- Isḥāq was the Father of Yaʿqūb was, who is referred to as 'Īsrā'īl. He migrated to Egypt with his sons during the rule of Yūsuf with, forming the 12 tribes of Banū 'Isrā'īl.

- A few hundred years later, **1500 BCE**, **Palestine** fell under **Egyptian rule**.
- The descendants of Ishāq were enslaved and oppressed. Mūsā were born amongst these people.
- After crossing the Red Sea with the **Banū Isrā'īl**, Allāh commanded them to fight the tyrannical Canaanites.
- The **Banū Isrā'īl** were ungrateful and cowardly and said:

"They said, "O **Mūsā**, indeed we will not enter it, ever, as long as they are within it; so go, you and your Lord, and fight. Indeed, we are remaining right here." {5:24}

- Allāh Taʿālā replied: "Then this land is forbidden to them for **forty years**, during which they will wander through the land. So do not grieve for the rebellious people." **{5:26}**
- After these years passed, Yūshā^c ibn Nūn see entered Palestine and captured it from the Canaanites.
- It was then divided between the 12 tribes of Banū Isrā'īl.

- **1200 BCE** after the Trojan War, the **Philistines** established themselves on the coast of **Can'an** (**Palestine**).
- The 12 tribes of Banū Isrā[•]īl united under King Jālūt and battled the **Philistines**. Dāwūd ^{*}^{*} killed Jālūt (Goliath) as mentioned in the Qur[•]ān.
- He succeeded **King Țālūt** and united the tribes.
- He then moved towards **Jerusalem**, which was ruled by the Jebusites-a Canaanite tribe, and defeated them, designating **Jerusalem** as their capital.
- He then built the Masjid in Al 'Aqṣā compound.
- After his death, **Sulaymān** *completed the Masjid*.
- The Jews refer to it as their temple and believe it to be the first house of God.

- After Sulaymān's death, enmity reappeared among the Jewish tribes and by 922 BCE, the kingdom split into 2:
 - **1.Northern Palestine** named Samaria. It consisted of 10 tribes.
 - **2.Southern Palestine** named Judea with Jerusalem as its capital. It consisted of 2 tribes. ('Jew' originated from Judea.)
- 722 BCE the Assyrians took advantage of their rivalry and conquered Samaria, i.e., Northern Palestine.
- Judea fell into idolatry and in 586 BCE, the King of Babylon attacked and destroyed everything taking Jerusalem's surviving population to Babylon.
- Around **550 BCE** the **Persian Empire** captured **Babylon**, including **Jerusalem**. They allowed the **Jews** to return to **Jerusalem**.
- **538 BCE-** The **second temple** was reconstructed.

- 200 years later, in 330 BCE, Alexander the 3rd conquered Jerusalem.
- 323 BCE, he died, and the kingdom was split between the Ptolemy and Seleucids. The Seleucids took control of present-day Palestine, Syria, Jordan and Iraq.
- **164 BCE** the **Jews** rebelled against the **Seleucids** in the **Maccabean** revolt, recapturing **Jerusalem**, however internal conflict prevented any **Jew** from gaining power over the land.
- Whilst this was occurring, the **Roman Empire** was expanding.
- **63 BCE** they conquered **Jerusalem**.
- 'Īsā شَلْعَالَةُ is born.
- Maryam was born in Nazareth and there she gave birth to '**Īsā** we'. The **Jews** rejected him and approached the **Roman governor** to have him crucified. (Allāh forbid)
- During his time on Earth, Palestine's population was a mixture of Jews, Sabeans, Pagans and Romans.

- **66 CE** the **Jews** revolted against the **Romans** and were therefore, banished.
- For the next **249 years**, **Christians** ruled over **Palestine**.
- **614 CE** the **Persian Empire**, with the help of the **Jews**, attacked and conquered **Jerusalem**.
- **624 CE Heraclius** recaptured **Jerusalem**. This is mentioned in Sūrah al- Rūm.
- Jews were completely banished and persecuted across the entire empire.
- Up until this point, **Palestine** was ruled by many groups. However, there was no **Jewish** rule or kingdom. They only existed in small batches.



- **570 CE** The Prophet ﷺ was born.
- **637 CE** Muslims conquered most of **Shām** and under the Khilāfah of **Umar** is entered the city of **Jerusalem** peacefully.
- 'Umar تظلیف signed a treaty and Palestine came under Muslim rule.
- In this Treaty, **Jews** were not allowed to settle ***inside* Jerusalem**, however for the first time in 500 years, they were allowed to **live and practice freely** in its ***vicinity***.
- The city was in a state of stability it had never known before.

- Many eras of caliphate passed until it reached to **al Hakim**, a **Shi'ite caliph**.
- He persecuted Christians and Sunni Muslims.
- His destruction of the church of **Holy Sepulcher** triggered a European invasion.
- In **1099**, the **Crusaders**, one of the gravest invaders which the region had suffered under the scourges of military expeditions, arrived at the gates of **Jerusalem**.
- Upon their entry, they massacred and slaughtered every **Muslim** and burnt many **Jews** to death.
- It was the **bloodiest massacre** the land had ever witnessed, **before today**.
- After this defeat, Muslims saw it as punishment for leaving the way of Jihād, therefore Nur ul- Din al Zenghi revived this by recapturing Aleppo and Edessa. This triggered a second crusade, which failed miserably, and Europeans were forced to retreat.

- ➢ The key factor that contributed towards the **defeat** of the **Muslim Armies of Shām** against the **First Crusaders** was the 'Shia Menace'!
- Non- Muslim historians, also agree with this, saying the success of the first Crusade was:

"not the size of any army of the **European** foot soldiers and knights. 10,000 knights and 30,000-foot soldiers were indeed a powerful force, but the **Muslims** could have easily matched it. However, the **crusades** benefitted from the **age-old split** in the **Muslim** population between the **Orthodox Sunni Muslims** and the **Shiite Muslims**."

- Salāḥuddīn Al-Ayyubī, one of the greatest generals the world has ever seen began his journey of reconquering Al 'Aqṣā by dismantling the Shia regime.
- After 16 years of toil, this regime eventually collapsed, saving not only **Islām** but a kufrī (heretical) ideology from spreading throughout the world.
- The next **15 years** Muslim armies mobilized and launched attack upon attack against the **Christian fort-holds** of **Shām**.
- The **Battle of Hittin** the largest **crusader army** was destroyed.
- On the night of 27th of Rajab 583 A.H / 2nd Oct 1187 CE- Salāḥuddīn along with the Muslim army emancipated Al 'Aqṣā from the hands of the Christian crusaders.

- During the centuries **1150-1550**, **Jews** in **Europe** were persecuted relentlessly, forcing them to flee.
- Only 2.3% of the Jewish population i.e., 55,000 Jews, settled in Palestine.
- The **Ottoman Empire** was formed **100 years** after **Salāḥuddīn's** victory and was an extremely strong empire conquering lands and spreading **Islām**.
- Due to the infiltration of **European secular ideologies** and the instilment of nationalism into the **Muslims**, the empire weakened.
- Thereupon, came the last standing Sultan, **Sultan** 'Abdul Hamid the 2nd.
- He aimed to revive **khilāfah** and **unite Muslims** under the banner of **Islām**.

- Back in **Europe**, year **1881**, the **lovers of Zion** emerged. Their intent is to find a homeland for the **Jews**.
- Theodore Herzl, AKA the father of Zionism.
- His aim: a Jewish home in the land where Banū Isrā'īl once lived.
- Herzl wrote to the Ottoman empire, attempting to make deals so Jews can settle in Palestine.
- "I will not sell a single inch of the country, because it is not mine, it belongs to all **Muslims**. They paid for this empire with their blood. And we will redeem it with our blood. Let the **Jews** keep their millions. If the empire is partitioned, they can get **Palestine** for free, but that will happen over our dead bodies" i.e. at the collapse of the **Ottoman Empire**.

- Herzl was then, in need of a governmental body, so he turned to the British.
- 1896- First Zionist congress- the birth of political Zionism.
- **1896-7**: **Zionist** manifesto was created and published.
- British antisemitism + colonial thirst coincided with Jewish Zionism.
- The Jews demanded Palestine.
- WW1- Zionists agreed to be outposts of the British. In exchange, a public declaration of political support for Zionism was to be made.

- 1916- the British and French made a secret agreement to decide on who would take control of the Arab territories of the Ottoman Empire once WW1 was over. This is referred to as the Sykes Picot Agreement. The British was given Palestine.
- The **Sultan** is overthrown, and **Palestine** is promised to the **Jews**.
- The **Balfour declaration** is written.
 - "The establishment in **Palestine** of a national home for the **Jewish people**."

White paper release:

- Zionists will have no authority but will live as refugees.

- 1935- WW2- Nazi holocaust in full effect
- Thousands of **Jews** immigrate to Palestine.
- Zionists, now 30% of the population, have formed secret gangs and militia and begin killing the British and Palestinians. The holocaust continues.
- **1947** The **British** leave. The **Zionists** become too difficult for them to handle.
- The Zionists now pressure the US to create a Jewish State.
- They implement a **partition plan**. **Jews** were given **55%** of **Palestinian** land despite constituting **37%** of the population and owning **less than 7%** land.





Before the creation of the Israeli State.



• **1948** - The **state** of '**Israel**' is declared.

- Thousands of **Palestinians** killed.
- 700, 000 displaced.
- Over 500 homes, destroyed
- This is known as the Nakba (the Catastrophe).

- **1967** Six-Day War.
- 20,000 Palestinians killed.
- **300,000** displaced.
- Entirety of **Palestine** fell under **Israeli** occupation.
- Settlements were built (against international law) and settlers are permitted to be armed.
- 1987- the first intifada/Palestinian uprising. It lasted 6 years.
- Hamas was thereby founded.

SOCIAL & POLITICAL

- The first intifada occurred (1987), lasting 6 years.
- In **1993**, the **Oslo Accords** was signed.
- Israel accepted the PLO (Palestinian liberation Organization) as representatives of the Palestinians, and the PLO renounces 'terrorism' i.e., Hamas and the Islamic Jihād and recognizes Israel's right to exist in peace.
- In essence, this was **Israel** being formally recognized, whilst the **Palestinians** got nothing in return.
- The **PLO** took the prerequisites of power, mainly money and status and became the **PA- Palestinian Authority** who work as an administrative and police network for **Israel**. (bought out)

"Oslo was the greatest idea Israel ever had. It let them continue the occupation without paying any of the costs."

- After the **first Intifada (1987)**, a **permit system** was introduced.
- **Palestinians** are required to show a **difficultto-obtain** permit in order to **work** or **travel** to other occupied territories.
- •1995 Israel built an electronic fence and concrete wall around Gaza, barring them from other occupied territories.



In **2002- Israel** began constructing a **wall** that cuts off the **West Bank** from the rest of **'Israel'**. **85%** of the **wall** itself is on the inside of the **West Bank**, **decreasing** the size of the **West Bank** and bringing more under **Israeli** control.



The **Palestinians inside the wall** must go through **checkpoints** and deal with **Israeli settlers** daily inside the **West Bank**. At the **beginning** of **2023**, it was reported that **645 movement** obstacles were deployed by **Israeli** forces, including **checkpoints**, **roadblocks**, **road gates**, **barriers**, **trenches**, **earth walls etc**.



- It is deliberately designed in such a way that it ensures no viable system comes out of the West Bank.
- This Wall imposes many restrictions on the Palestinians in the West Bank, including but not limited to, agriculture, import and export, food, water, etc.

- Following the **second intifada** In **2005**, many permits were **cancelled**, and the number of permits issued, **reduced**.
- 2007- a land, air and sea blockade was imposed on Gaza.
- 'Israel' controls the airspace and territorial waters, as well as 2 of the 3 border crossing points (the 3rd is controlled by Egypt).

- This siege led to a shortage of the basic necessities of life: food, water and fuel.
 - **1.3 million** out of **2.1 million Palestinians** require food assistance.
 - This was funded and provided by the **UNRWA**.
 - 2023: countries have stopped their funding on suspicion of 0.04% of UNRWA members being affiliated with Hamas.
 - Offshore Gaza Strip, Palestinians have reservoirs of oil and natural gas. These resources, if developed can meet Palestinian needs for energy and export revenues.
 - The exploitation is prohibited by 'Israel',
 - Losses in the billions.

- Since the beginning of the siege, **Israel** has launched **4 military assaults** in years:
 - 2008
 - 2012
 - 2014
 - 2021
- Each attack resulted in more **Palestinian** deaths and more destruction to infrastructure (homes, schools and office buildings).
- Rebuilding has been near impossible since the siege **prevents** construction materials from entering **Gaza**.



- The missile attacks have also damaged Gaza's pipelines and sewage infrastructure. Due to this, sewage water seeps into drinking water.
 - Increase in waterborne diseases.
 - More than 95% of Gaza's water is unsafe.
- Improving the water quality has been unfeasible due to the ongoing power crisis.
- To power **Gaza 24/7, 600 megawatts** of electricity is needed.
 - Receives- 180 megawatts
- 'Israel controls fuel, therefore controlling their electricity:
 - 8 hrs.- on 8 hrs.- off
 - In summer- 12 hrs. off

Unemployment and Education

- Unemployment rate in Gaza = highest in the world
- Unemployment rate 46.6% Youth unemployment = 62.5%
- Farmers source of income destroyed or contaminated by Israel.

• Education- 31% of households have difficulty meeting essential education needs due to lack of financial resources.

Arrests i.e., Palestinian Hostages

- Since **1967**, **Israel** has arrested an estimated of 1 Million Palestinians.
- An estimated **10,000** are **children** as young as **9**.
- Arrested without **crime** or **trial**.
- Subjected to the worst of tortures. (Starvation, forced to stripped, rape etc.)

West Bank: Settlements

- Israel settlements are scattered everywhere.
- Sizes of **towns** and **cities**.
- Completely segregated.
- It is a state driven **project**, and the **most expensive** project 'Israel' has undertaken.
- Settlers commit violent atrocities:
 - **Raiding Palestinian** houses in the middle of the night.
 - **Burning** properties and trees.
 - Injure and murder Palestinians.
- Palestinians cannot retaliate or they may end up in jail for unknown periods of time.
- Settlers- 3% conviction rate.


- Palestinian population is increasing at a rapid rate, yet housing remains unavailable.
- Palestinians born in Jerusalem are required to show a construction permit.
- Permits = expensive and difficult to obtain.
- Build their own homes with the **threat** of **demolition looming**.
- Demand-15,000 houses annually. Issued- 5,700.
- As of **2022 55,000** houses have been demolished.
- The Jerusalem Municipality has expedited the pace of house demolitions in East Jerusalem since Oct.7th, with 140 homes demolished in 2023, marking a 60% increase from the preceding year. Alongside these, 84 other structures, including shops and warehouses, were also demolished.



3 elements:

- **1.** Intent to **maintain domination** by one racial group over another.
- 2. A context of **systematic oppression** by the dominant group over the marginalized group.
- **3. Inhumane acts** such as **"forcible transfer**" and **"expropriation** (dispossessing) **of landed property**."

Hagai El-Ad, the former director of the Israeli human rights group B'Tselem, wrote, "There is not a single square inch in the territory Israel controls where a Palestinian and a Jew are equal."

• Let us take a moment to talk about UN resolutions and USA being complicit in every Israeli scheme. Israel has been condemned in 45 resolutions by year 2013 and between 2015 and 2022; UN has passed 140 resolutions on Israel (68 in other countries). Since 1945, a total of 36 UNSC draft resolutions related to Israel-Palestine have been vetoed and of these 36, 34 were vetoed by the USA. Regarding resolutions pertaining to Israel alone, **USA** has vetoed **46 times**.



- The most contested piece of territory since Israel's occupation in 1967.
 - Land belongs to international community.
 - Internal matters- Waqf/ Islamic Trust.
 - External matters- 'Israel'.
- > Despite this, **Israel violates** such rules by:
 - Wounding, arresting and murdering Palestinians entering the Masjid.
 - Enforcing permits.
 - Extreme checkpoints.
 - Raiding the Masjid.
 - Even closing it the compound.

Hence the "Ṭūfān Al-'Aqṣā/Flood of Al-'Aqṣā" carried out by Hamas.

Whols HAMA?

H.A.M.A.S- Islamic Resistance Movement

- Governs the Gaza Strip after winning the elections in 2007.
- Founded in 1987 by Shiekh Ahmed Yassin, the political and religious leader, along with his aide Abdul Aziz al Rantissi.
- Military Wing- Izz al Din Al Qassam Brigade .
- Hamas does not recognize Israels statehood as Khaled Meshaal said:

"We shall not waive an inch of the Palestinian home soil no matter what the recent pressures are and no matter how long the occupation lasts."



Does The International Community Consider Hamas A Terrorist Organization?

- Only Western Colonial Powers (NA and EU), Japan, Paraguay and Israel have designated Hamas or only its military as a terrorist organization.
- Most states including the UN do not deem Hamas such.
- Furthermore states, including **Russia**, **China**, **Syria**, **Turkey** and **Iran** consider the (ARMED) STRUGGLE waged by **Hamas** to be **LEGITIMATE**. (Refer to Wikipedia for further details)



 Designated Hamas as a terrorist organization
 Designated the <u>military wing</u> of Hamas as a terrorist organization.
 The rest of the world including the UN does not consider HAMAS a terrorist organisation

<u>What Triggered October 7th?</u>

• Hamas spokesperson Khaled Qadomi told Al Jazeera:

"We want the international community to stop atrocities in Gaza against Palestinian people, our holy sites like Al-'Aqṣā [Mosque]. All these things are the reason behind starting this battle."

• Hamas had become aware of 'Israels' plan to destroy the Al Aqṣā site and clear the area to build a Third Temple.

"The trigger for the 7th October attack was Hamas's concern that far-right Jews intended to sacrifice an animal at the site of Al Aqṣā Mosque, thus laying the ground for the demolition of the Dome on the Rock shrine and the Building of the Third Temple."
